This month's featured business: AmeriGas of Negaunee

In 1995, AmeriGas, the country's largest propane supplier, saw an opportunity in the Upper Peninsula and opened a new office in Negaunee on US-41. The decision has since proven to be successful, as the company continues to thrive.

AmeriGas of Negaunee supplies propane for residential, commercial and industrial uses. The company also installs tanks and provides safety leak checks. It's a service that District Manager Charles Van Beynen says is unique to AmeriGas as safety is their number one concern.

Van Beynen is new to the company, joining the team in September 2010. He says he's looking forward to increasing AmeriGas' involvement in the community, specifically with non-profit organizations and area schools.

Currently AmeriGas participates in the "School Days" program, a fundraising opportunity for schools. Customers save their propane bills, schools collect them and AmeriGas gives a percentage of the total back to the school district.

Van Beynen says his first four months with AmeriGas has gone well. He's enjoying getting to know his customers, their names and faces.

"Working in the U.P., in Marquette County, with local residents is a tremendous benefit of this job," he added. "Our customers are really good people."

This is the busy season for AmeriGas. Keeping people warm through the winter, businesses operating and machines running... from now until spring it will be nonstop. And they look forward to many more years of servicing the U.P.


